

NON-INVASIVE Prostate MRI

A non-invasive procedure is one where the introduction of instruments into the body is not required. A biopsy or a prostate ultrasound with an endorectal probe would count as invasive exams.

However, A prostate MRI does not require devices entering the body. This is the most comfortable prostate evaluation thus far.

The examination takes approximately 45 minutes. This procedure simply requires an intravenous injection of Gadolinium.

This procedure does not require the use of any endorectal devices.

Prostate cancer is the most often diagnosed malignant growth and the second leading cause of death in men. 1 in 6 men will be diagnosed with this disease in their lifetime. Early detection is key in determining appropriate treatment course.

With the recent advances in imaging techniques, MRI now plays an increasingly important role in advanced detection of clinically significant prostate cancer. With the recent use of what is termed "Multiparametric MRI", There is widely increasing evidence supporting the efficacy of Prostate MRI.

MRI can play many roles in the study of prostate cancer

It allows for:

- Accurate and reliable localization of tumors within the gland
- Accurate assessment of local staging of the disease
- Defining whether the disease extends beyond the gland itself.

Prostate MRI can also be used for active disease surveillance
